

New Beginnings

The Board of Directors of The Museum School of Avondale Estates unanimously appointed Mike Stewart, currently principal at Liberty Tech Charter School in Fayette County, as the TMS principal at a board meeting March 28.

This appointment becomes effective July 1, 2019.






